More about Saving Resources & Making Valuable Connections:

Using the <u>freelender.org</u> website, there are two ways to make the request. One is to search for something; the other is to add the item you want eg '*WANTED - lawnmower'* so that others can decide whether to lend theirs to you, or suggest another way to buy/share whatever you want. Please take a few moments to think how you could save money by just asking for something.
